Dr Romain Chuffart specialises in international law and governance of the polar regions, with a focus on Indigenous Peoples' rights, international environmental and climate law, the law of the sea and ocean governance. His publications appear in both specialised polar and broader international law journals. He conducts theoretical research on public international law, combining insights from political theory, international relations, political geography, and other social sciences, and engages critically with legal theory to explore non-doctrinal approaches and global justice.

Leads research on polar law, ocean governance, and Arctic policy, with particular focus on Indigenous rights, climate interventions, and autonomous shipping. Developed innovative frameworks in “Blue-Ocean Justice” and polar legal theory and published extensively in peer-reviewed journals and policy outlets. Coordinated multiple international grant applications exceeding 3 million EUR (EU, NordForsk, Research Council of Norway, RANNÍS) and built collaborative networks across 15+ countries. Led and coordinated a consortium of six universities for an application to an EU Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions Doctoral Network on Arctic Ocean Governance (submitted on 25 November 2025; under review). Participated in and organised 30+ conferences, workshops, and symposiums, including at Arctic Circle Assembly, Polar Law Symposium, Critical Legal Conference, European International Studies Association, and Arctic Science Summit Week. Supervised 3 graduate and 3 undergraduate students, maintains active teaching duties (approx. 12 contact hours in Arctic Law and Policy, the Rights of Indigenous Peoples in the Arctic, and Antarctic Law and Policy), and engages with policymakers and the public through briefings and media commentary.

**Sessional Instructor, University Centre of the Westfjords, Iceland (October 2023 – present)**, teaching and coordinating (umsjón) a 6 ECTS course on Arctic Ocean Governance to graduate students in the MA in Coastal Communities and Regional Development and the MA in Coastal and Marine Management.
